Local World AIDS Day Events

World AIDS Day is December 1st. It is an internationally recognized day to raise awareness for HIV/AIDS and is an opportunity to fight the stigma associated with it. World AIDS Day was the first ever global health day. It was first held in 1988.

A Candlelight Service will take place on Monday, December 2nd, 6 p.m. at the Andersen Enrichment Center, 120 Ezra Rust Drive, in Saginaw. This event is free and open to the public. Refreshments will follow the service. Hosted by Sacred Heart Rehabilitation Center's AIDS Care Program.

The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) will host a Community Conversation focusing on HIV at Bethel A.M.E. Church Multipurpose Hall, 535 Cathay, Saginaw, MI 48601 on Sunday, December 1, 2013, from 3:00pm-5:00pm. Refreshments will be served.

Also, you have until December 2nd to see the 14 foot AIDS ribbon on display at the Saginaw County Courthouse, 111 S Michigan Ave, Saginaw, MI 48602. The ribbon display represents the impact of HIV/AIDS in our area, and represents support in decreasing HIV rates and stigma, and increasing care and education of the disease.

Remembering Fred Eland:

A Perceptions Friend and Volunteer

Fred Eland, or “The Fred” as many of his friends called him, passed away unexpectedly on Saturday, November 2. Fred found Perceptions in 2009 as he was beginning his journey coming out as a gay man following the death of his wife of 42 years.

Sadly, coming out cost Fred dearly as his only child, a son, was never able to accept Fred’s sexual orientation and remained estranged for the remainder of Fred’s life. At Fred’s memorial service, Fred’s sisters commented that Perceptions had “saved his life.” They believed that the acceptance

he found and the friendships that he formed helped to make bearable the pain of losing the relationship with his son. They were so grateful that they named Perceptions Saginaw Valley as one of the charities friends should consider for a memorial gift.

The Perceptions Men’s Discussion Group was a big part of Fred’s transformation from recently widowed and newly out gay man to become an active part of the local LGBT community. Fred’s good friend Jim commented, “It was an awesome thing to be privileged to see him blossom and become the man he had so long yearned to be.”

In 2010, Fred was awarded the “Rising Star” award at the Saginaw Valley LGBT Pride Awards Banquet. Fred was a kind and giving man who was always willing to help, volunteer, and contribute. Fred often told friends that he was glad to be able to give back to Perceptions because the organization had given him so much. He was involved in many of our projects and functions. You often found him selling 50/50 raffle tickets at events. It was his idea for Perceptions to apply for a raffle license from the Michigan Department of the Lottery. He also hosted several of our monthly meetings by providing snacks and refreshments.

At the time of Fred’s death, he was recovering at home from a recent surgery to relieve the intense pain caused by trigeminal neuralgia. This disorder was debilitating and had caused Fred to slow down in recent months but everyone was optimistic that he’d return to his old self after the surgery. His sister was staying with him while he recuperated. Fred was 68.

Fred was a member of our Perceptions family for less than five years, but our memories of him will be lasting.

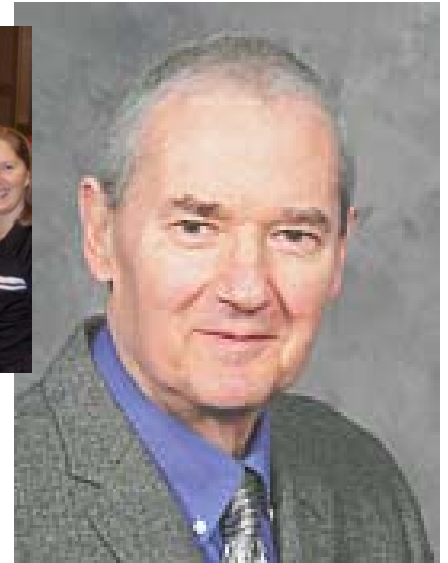
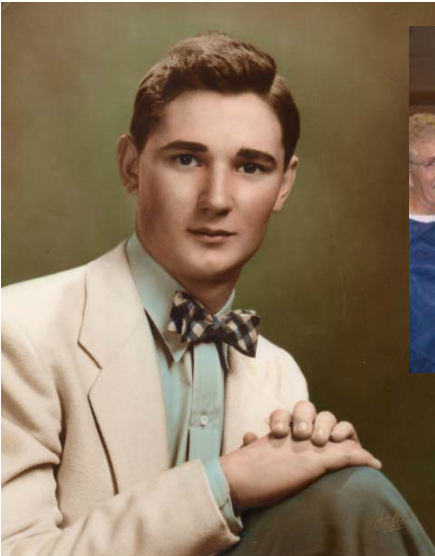

Remembering Chas Laundra:

Saginaw's Oldest Publicly Gay Man

At 79 years, Charles (Chas/Chuck) Laundra, Saginaw's oldest publicly gay man and Perceptions member, died October 2, 2013. He leaves his partner, Michael Mercer, former wife, Anne, and their three children and their families.

Chas was born November 11, 1933 in Saginaw, Michigan and graduated from St. Joseph Catholic High School in 1951. He served in the United States Air Force during the Korean Conflict, was a graduate of the London School of Dramatic Art and the American Theatre Wing (NYC). He married in 1956 and received a bachelor's degree from Illinois State University in 1963. He taught English at Bridgeport-Spaulling High School and then at Douglas MacArthur High School in Saginaw Township where he raised his family. In 1968 he accepted a field entertainment directorship for the US Armed Services and took his family abroad for three years to Bamberg, Germany. As a high school English, speech and drama educator, he directed two high school theatrical productions every year and nurtured many students' interests in the arts. He was a lifelong avid participant/supporter of Pit and Balcony Theatre and performed many roles on and offstage. Additionally, he performed at the Midland Center for the Arts.

After a 40 year marriage, Chas came out publicly, although he always knew he was gay. As

a guest speaker for PFLAG Tri-Cities (Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays), Chas explained that gays did not come out in the 1950s – it was no option for him. Families and society did not accept this then. Before he married Anne, he told her that he was gay. He always appreciated that Anne explained this with their adult children at the time of their divorce.

Chas was a gifted and talented man who enjoyed a wide variety of interests and hobbies – teaching drama, baking, knitting, making baskets, quilting, raising chickens, canaries and rabbits, training dogs, and these were just some of his interests.

As an active member of Perceptions, Chas attended most activities – monthly meetings, Friday Dinners, fundraisers, speakers, etc. He attended Gay Olympics in Chicago in 2006 and a Triangle Foundation (now Equality Michigan) dinner in Dearborn. He was aware of LGBT issues and donated regularly and generously to local, state and national LGBT groups and causes.

While Chas' life witnessed gays being killed by the Nazis and legally discriminated against in most states, he slowly saw families and society accepting gays equally, especially his family. Chas was a model for people who thought it was too late to come out.

The program provides for services to youth who have run away, are contemplating running away, or have been asked to leave the home. The Transitional Living Program was established to provide shelter, care and supportive services for homeless individuals between the ages of 16-21. It is an 8 bed facility.

It's that time again. Another year has gone by and it's time to renew your membership. Thank you to all our current 2013 members for a fantastic year.

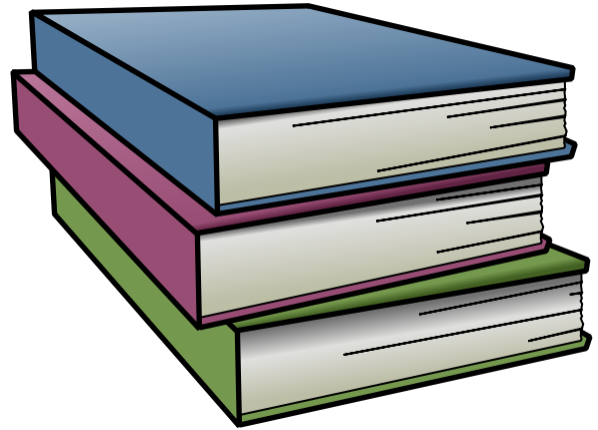
